"Culture is the soul of Europe" is the principle of European cultural policy. In particular in the Danube region, which has a diversity of cultures unique in Europe, promoting culture is of key importance as part of the EU's strategy for this region.

To give fresh impetus to multilateral cooperation between players from art, culture and politics in Southeastern Europe, Baden-Württemberg's Ministry of Science, Research and the Arts and the European Danube Academy are inviting representatives from the Danube region who work in very different areas in the field of cultural mediation, art and culture policy to the 1st International Danube Conference on Culture in Ulm on 15/16 April 2013. Its objective is to foster tightly-knit and sustained networking in the arts and culture in the Danube region.

115 million people live in the countries, regions, towns and cities through which the Danube flows. The Danube macroregion is shaped by different socio-economic systems. They are closely connected to the heterogeneity of the cultural identities and the unequal conditions for cultural work in Southeastern Europe. Cultural diversity – in terms of languages, religions and ways of life – can be understood as a valuable asset if the potentials of the individual countries along the Danube can be pooled by interdisciplinary, international cooperation, making "unity in diversity" a cultural trademark of the Danube region.

Functioning networks and cross-border sharing of resources are vital to successful cultural cooperation. Networks not only improve the basic economic conditions for creative artists, they also strengthen cultural ties and affinity in our own and others' perceptions. And so they create identity.

Culture shapes civil society and vice versa. Especially in the Danube region, cultural promotion and political encouragement of lively art and culture scenes are crucial to strengthening civil societies. The goal of the 1st International Danube Conference on Culture is to promote future cooperation by offering a platform where experience from practical local cultural work can be shared and current culture policy questions discussed and so to boost the opportunities of the "Danube cultural macroregion" in Europe.

WORKSHOP III "The importance of promoting culture in the development of civil societies in the Danube region"

A strong civil society represents a corrective to government bodies and market forms. A flourishing artistic and cultural landscape is vital to strengthening civil society structures in the Danube region. Promoting culture (mediation, networking, exchange) in the Danube region is of significance in terms of European policy and is a key factor in developing the macroregion.

The interplay between promoting culture and strengthening democratic societies is to be discussed in the workshop.
